Carburetor Trouble Shooting (Cont.)

CONDITION	POSSIBLE CAUSE	CORRECTION
▶ High fuel consumption	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) Fuel system leak 2) Wrong size jets 3) Faulty fuel inlet needle and/or seat 4) Fuel mixture setting incorrect 5) Dirty air cleaner 6) Excessive accelerator pump discharge 7) Intake air preheater not ON or OFF according to season 8) Enrichment system does not switch off 9) Choke valve not opening all the way 10) Secondary throttle opens too early 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) Locate and repair leak 2) Install correct jets 3) Replace needle and seat 4) Adjust idle RPM and mixture 5) Clean or replace 6) Test and adjust fuel discharge quantity 7) Temperature above 50°F (10°C), preheater should be OFF 8) Free up vacuum plunger 9) Adjust choke valve 10) Inspect secondary throttle linkage, adjust or repair as needed

▶ Engine Backfires into Intake Manifold	1) "Warm" control pressure incorrect (CIS) 2) Vacuum leak(s) 3) Idle mixture out of adjustment	1) Replace warm-up regulator 2) Repair vacuum leaks 3) Adjust mixture to specifications
▶ Engine Backfires into Exhaust Manifold	1) "Warm" control pressure incorrect (CIS) 2) Cold start valve leaks 3) Fuel system leaking 4) Idle mixture out of adjustment	1) Replace warm-up regulator 2) Clean or replace as necessary 3) Repair fuel leaks 4) Adjust mixture to specifications

Diesel Fuel Injection Trouble Shooting

CONDITION	POSSIBLE CAUSE	CORRECTION
HARD STARTING SYMPTOMS ▶ Engine cranks but will not start:	1) Incorrect fuel or no fuel 2) Glow plug not working properly 3) Air in fuel system 4) Faulty injector(s) 5) Injection pump faulty	1) Fill or replace fuel as necessary 2) Repair or replace as necessary 3) Bleed fuel system 4) Repair or replace 5) Repair as necessary
▶ Engine starts but will not run:	1) Air in fuel system 2) Modulator valve out of adjustment 3) Fuel lines, filter or tank plugged 4) Idle speed adjustment incorrect	1) Bleed fuel system 2) Adjust modulator valve 3) Clear fuel system 4) Adjust as necessary
LOW SPEED DRIVEABILITY SYMPTOM ▶ Engine runs rough:	1) Air or dirt in fuel system 2) Fuel system leak 3) Fuel flow uneven 4) Incorrect fuel 5) Governor or timing incorrect	1) Clean or Bleed fuel system 2) Repair fuel leaks 3) Repair as necessary 4) Change to correct fuel 5) Adjust to specifications
▶ Engine idle speed too high:	1) Idle speed set incorrectly 2) Modulator valve jammed 3) Governor improperly adjusted 4) Vacuum leaks in manifold	1) Adjust to specifications 2) Repair as necessary 3) Adjust to specifications 4) Repair vacuum leaks
▶ Poor acceleration:	1) Incorrect fuel 2) Timing device stuck in idle position 3) Fuel pump not operating correctly	1) Change to correct fuel 2) Repair as necessary 3) Repair or replace
▶ Engine knocks:	1) Incorrect fuel 2) Air in fuel system 3) Incorrect injection timing 4) Dirt in pump or injectors	1) Change to correct fuel 2) Bleed fuel system 3) Adjust timing 4) Clean and replace filter
